Who We Are

Founded in 2019, THE GIRL PROJECT empowers underprivileged adolescent girls in Ghana by fighting period poverty through a combination of menstrual health education, sanitary support, life skills training, and gender-sensitive school infrastructure.

Our 2024 Goals

- Expand WASH facilities in schools
- ✓ Provide 2,000 reusable menstrual kits
- ✓ Launch EmpowerHer Program
- ✓ Increase community engagement and advocacy

2024 Impact Highlights

Menstrual Health Support

- 1,036 girls received reusable menstrual hygiene kits
- 28 school-based workshops on menstrual health and hygiene conducted

WASH Infrastructure

- Built 2 new girl-friendly WASH blocks in rural schools
- Installed changing rooms with access to water and waste bins





Community Engagement

- Held 5 community sensitization events reaching 500+ parents and leaders
- Partnered with 3 local radio stations to air "Period Talks", promoting menstrual health

Empowerment and Education

- Formed 6 EmpowerHer Clubs in junior high schools
- Facilitated life skills training for 320 girls, including self-confidence, leadership, and digital literacy

Monitoring & Evaluation

- Attendance tracking: 42% reduction in school absenteeism during menstruation in project schools
- Survey data: 87% of beneficiaries reported improved menstrual hygiene knowledge
- Feedback loops: Regular teacher and student feedback informs session designs and WASH use
